She said, "I'm here because it's about the life. I am a pro-life supporter. My husband and I adopted our son. He's 29 years old. I'm 67. I pray a lot that he will have a safe birth and have a life." Since the Triangle Junior League had organized this event, McCormick was joining the rally with the support of the organization. "It's a sin. We believe it's a sin. A baby should be protected," she said. Laurin Lowery, manager of the Asheville Place Mall, said there was no organized group
